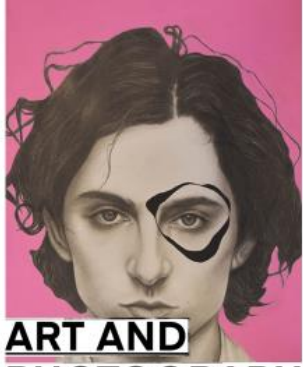
### THE ANTHEA BELL PRIZE LEVEL 4

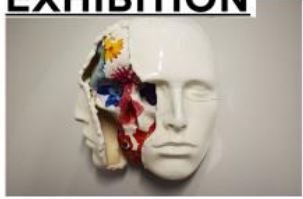
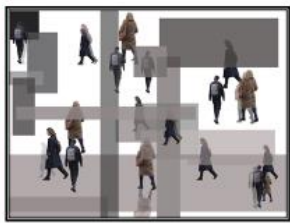
- Bugler!

## Learn with the Lords

On **Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> June** the following Year 12 students: Millie May Pymm, Jack Ward, Lola Coleman-Price, Ellie-Mae Vincent, Joseph Rouse, Emily Poulton, Isabel Reeves and Leah O'Hagan, took part in an online question and answer session with Lord Kirkhope of Harrogate, a member of the House of Lords. Students asked an array of questions such as what type of peer Lord Kirkhope is, what he thinks about the proposed reforms to the House of Lords, his view on whether the House of Lords can influence policy such as the cost-of-living crisis and his opinion on the admission process to the House of Lords. As a lawyer and a politician, Lord Kirkhope was able to give some enlightening insights into how the House of Lords works. Overall, it was a fantastic session and students got a lot out of it.
